

Muslim Ban

To colloborate with Congressional allies to guarantee no reiteration of the Muslim Ban or other religiously charged immigration policies.

Admission Ceiling

To demand the incoming Executive administration maintain current admission ceilings for refugees and immigrants of all backgrounds. So that those applying for entry from diverse and minority backgrounds have an equitable immigration process.

First Asylum Status

To ensure that the U.S. remains a safe harbor for those fleeing violence, persecution, and crisis, aligning with humanitarian obligations and fostering a compassionate, inclusive society that values human rights and dignity.



Watchlisting

MPAC is committed to challenging post-9/11 policies that allow government agencies to compile lists targeting Muslim Americans without due process. We actively work to dismantle discriminatory surveillance practices and advocate for fair treatment of all Americans under the law.





MPAC supports a mandatory reporting process for state and local law enforcement to accurately report hate crimes to the FBI, ensuring consistent data collection. By tying this to current funding, we aim to create a more streamlined, accurate process without additional financial burdens.

Islamophobe Appointment Tracker

MPAC will monitor nominees for key cabinet and appointed positions, opposing individuals who have a record of promoting White supremacist ideologies or Islamophobic views. This vigilance helps protect our communities from discriminatory policies.





University Assesment Project

MPAC's Bureau of Academic Freedom is examining the impact of campus protests on students, focusing on how such events impact First Amendment freedoms. By addressing these challenges, MPAC aims to foster environments where diverse voices are respected and university administrations are held accountable for ensuring equitable and supportive policies for all students.

Demilitarizing Campus Police

MPAC plans to build upon its UC Campus Advocacy Campaign by preventing universities from deploying military-grade weapons against students and campus protesters. MPAC will persist in its demand to strip campus police of access to such weaponry and maintain the position that use of such weapons is a brutal and disproportionate response to first amendment expressions.

Protecting Free Speech Of Our Students

MPAC has stridently opposed efforts to expand the definition used by the Department of Education of Anti-Semitism to include criticism of Israel, potentially jeopardizing federal funding for colleges and universities that do not sufficiently suppress voices critical of Israel. On Capitol Hill, that means pushing the Senate to vote againt the Antisemitism Awareness Act.
